Jade's Bunny Colours



This simple colour recognition game can be used in a multiple of ways. Vary and extend the game to suit the age of your children.

Storage Bag

Keep all your printed game pieces safe by making a storage bag :-

- Print out the 'Jade's Bunny Colours' page- there is a choice of black & white or a colour version..... and laminate.
- Laminate another A4 sheet and sticky tape 3 of the sides together.
- Once you've made it into an open topped envelope slot all the playing pieces inside.

For very young children only have one or two colours on the go at once!! Too many can be very confusing & they'll be forgotten quickly!

Colour recognition game ideas



Using food: -

Lay the coloured rabbits down onto a table top – and place one piece of fruit onto the rabbit's tummy!

Fruit or vegetable	Colour!
Grapes, cucumber, apple	Green
Strawberries	Red
Pineapple, banana	Yellow
Plum, grapes	Purple
Orange, carrot	Orange
Raisins	Brown
Tricky one! Blueberries or mix a little food colouring with some cream cheese – spread onto pieces of celery or small round crackers.	Blue

- Ask if you can 'please have the 'Red' strawberry.....'

Bearing in mind that little ones will probably be learning the name of the fruits as well as their colours at the same time – so expect lots of mistakes ☺

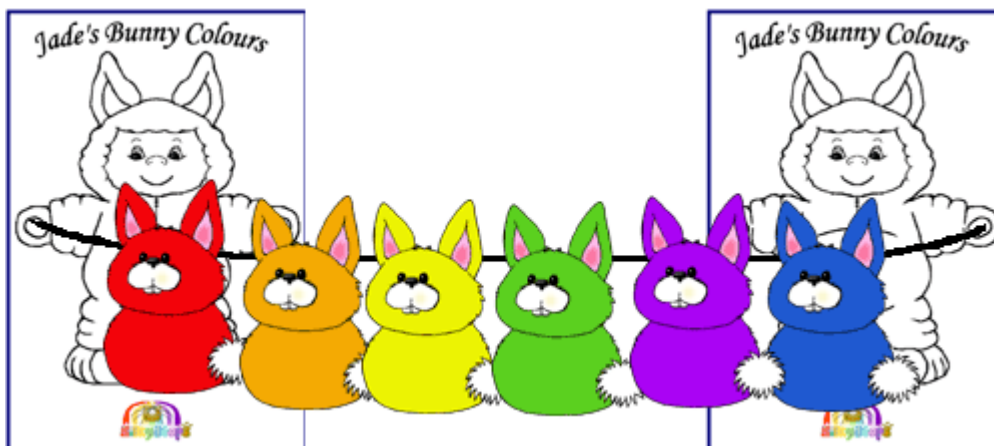
- Decide who is going to eat the piece of fruit or if you are going to put into a bowl (which can also be colour coordinated!) for later!



Colour line – Print out a collection of the rabbits – use the black & white template if you want to add some other colours – Gold & Silver for Christmas time could be nice.

Print off two sheets of the storage bag front – Tac these to a wall etc, join them together with a length of string or ribbon.

Attach the rabbits with a clothes peg or paper clip – let the child take off Call out a colour and let the children take it from the line – once they are removed – reverse it and ask for them to be pegged back onto the ribbon!



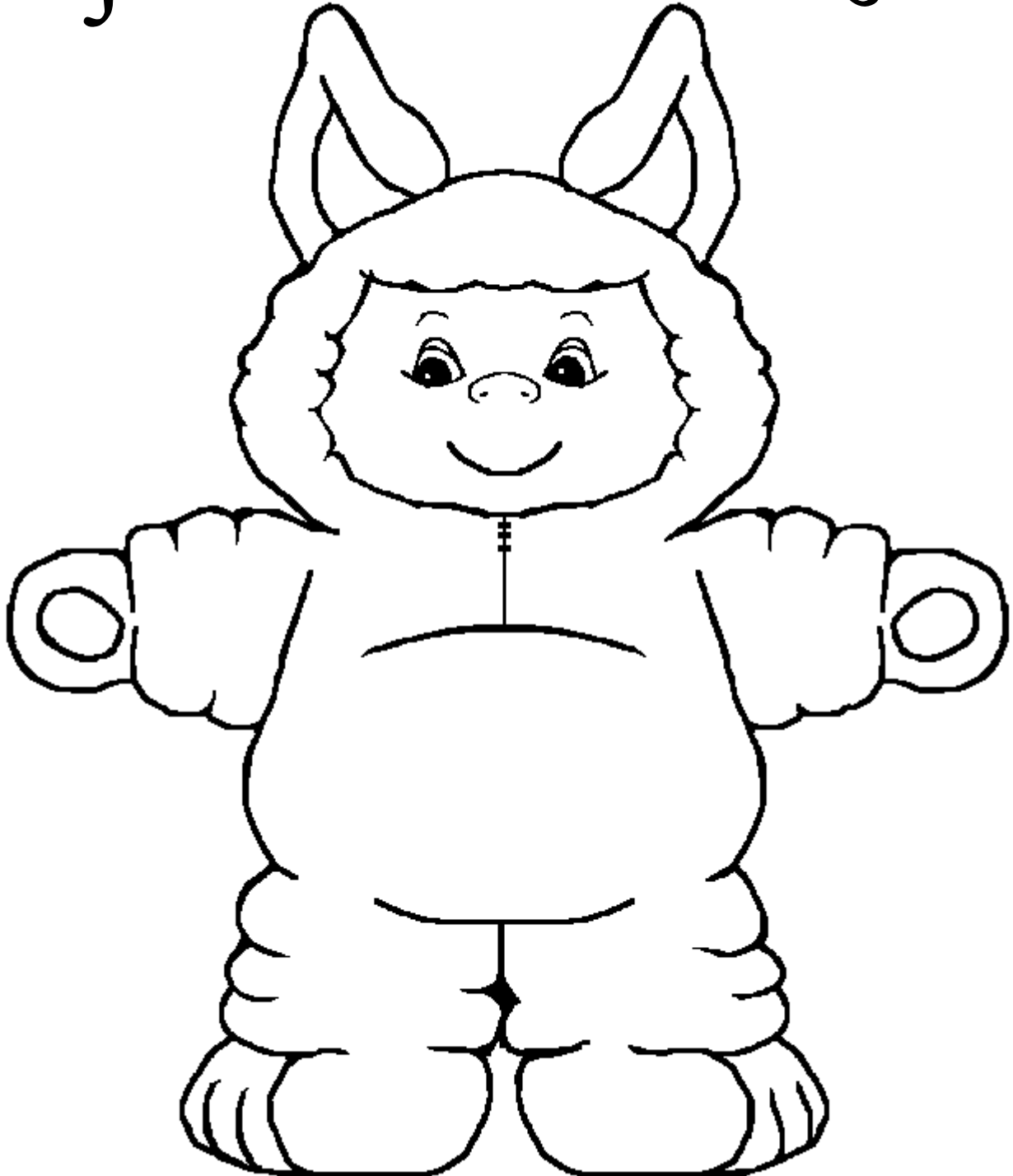
Number line – as for the colour line although you may need to print out more rabbits and use a longer length of ribbon.
Write large numbers on each front and attach ☺ .

Colour tic tac toe – teach older children how to play noughts and crosses by using the empty board below Print out 2 sets of small coloured rabbits and by taking turns to place a rabbit counter on the board see who can get 3 in a row!

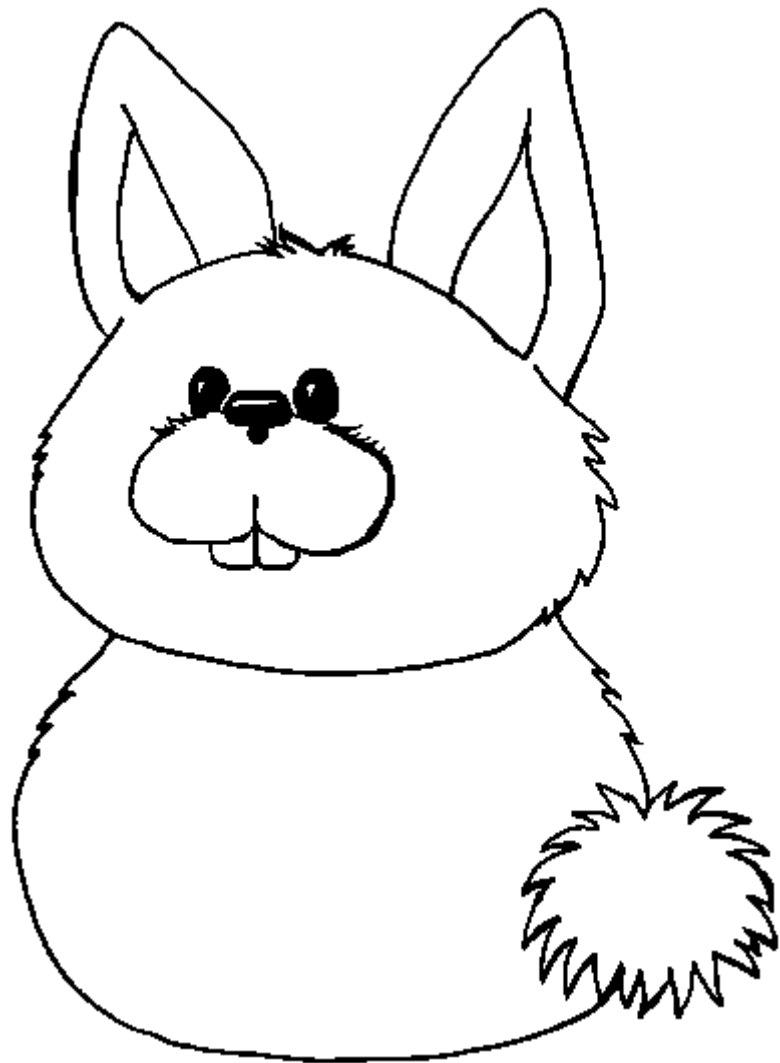

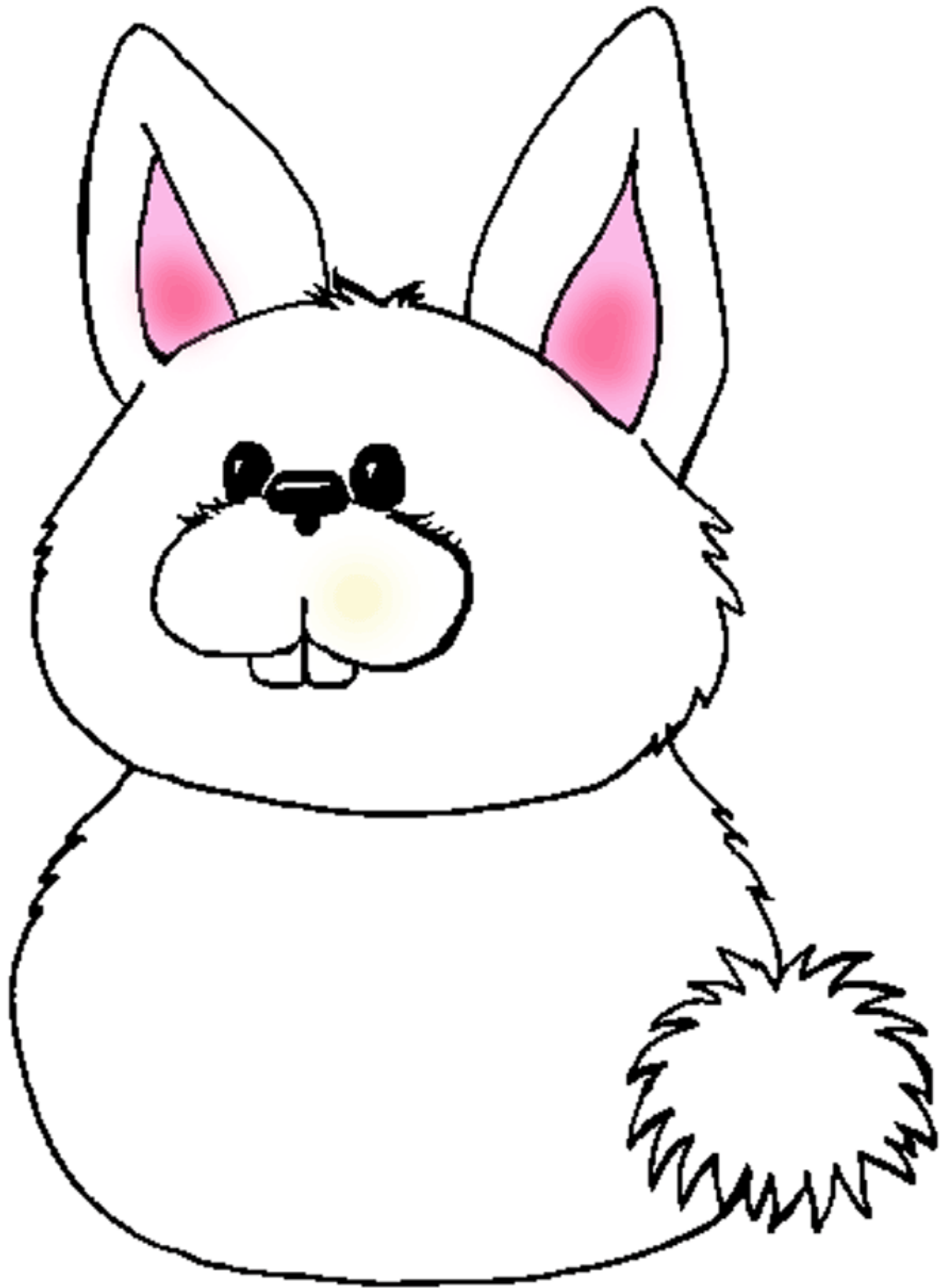
